TRASH MAN: Chris Kehoe was present to review with the City Council the current agreement regarding recycling in the City of Jewell. Every residential property is billed \$1.90 per month on their water bill to have recycling picked up on the first and third Friday’s of every month. It has been requested that the City Council consider approving weekly recycling at the cost of \$4.00 per month. Several citizens were present and had an opportunity to voice their opinion.
